A Message from the President of the Board

What happens to an organization when its singularly creative founder dies? We will surely never see another Naomi Feil nor can we replace her. Her personal stamp on VTI is deeply branded as she has been the face, voice, heart, and soul of the Validation Method since she devised this unique approach to person centered geriatric dementia care in the 1970s. It has been gratifying to see the large scale media attention brought on by Naomi's death on December 24, 2023. How many new potential users of Validation just learned about it because of a Wall Street Journal article, an obituary in the New York Times, or a segment on the Sunday Today Show? How do we continue to move forward to keep her spirit alive?

I am reminded of another singular individual with an incredible vision named Steve Jobs, best known for cofounding the technology giant, Apple as well as founder of NEXT and chairman of PIXAR. Jobs, like Naomi, had an unusual personal background that shaped his outlook. He was raised by adoptive parents, dropped out of Reed College to become a videogame designer at Atari as a teenager. He embraced Buddhism; he was a bit eccentric and thought outside of the box. Jobs saw something others did not: the widespread appeal of personal computers. He shared his dreams with his high school friend, electrical engineer Steve Wozniak. Jobs wanted to design computers that would be small enough and affordable enough to meet the average person's needs. This young man had a vision which transformed the world, despite his death in 2011 at the age of 56. The culture he created at Apple did not die with him, the products have continued to evolve and be innovative, the brand continues to stand for quality in a market flooded by competitors. While Naomi's demise was heartbreaking, it permitted us to say good bye to her and for her to say good bye to us. We promised her we would continue her work and that is why we are here today. We have carefully curated her wisdom, her humor, her uncanny ability to emphathize and communicate so that her impact can continue to grow and help more people dealing with the personal challenges of dementia.

Some day Validation will be the gold standard of geriatric dementia care throughout the world. It will become so widely adopted that people will wonder how we ever got along without it, just like that personal computer on your desk or in your pocket.

Stacey Hand, a Certified Validation Teacher and Dementia Educator at The Bridge Alzheimer's & Dementia Resource Center in Shreveport, Louisiana, recently presented at their 3rd annual caregiver conference. Her breakout session, titled "Choosing the Right Care Environment: Navigating the Different Levels of Care," explored the pros and cons of various community living options for aging individuals.

Stacey shared her decade-long expertise in independent senior living, assisted living, and long-term care, emphasizing that there is no one-size-fits-all solution. She discussed factors such as staying at home, independent living communities, assisted living, long-term care, and memory care, highlighting the importance of considering individual preferences and needs in the decision-making process.

Validation in China 🔲

In partnership with Senior Living L'Amour in Beijing, VTI completed its first online Level 3 training with 5 future Validation Teachers. The online course consisted of 6 webinars, 3.5 hours each and a follow-up session to answer questions about the testing material: Written Work, Theory Test, and 30-minute Video Presentation. It was a special challenge for the

Teachers of this new way of offering Level 3 training, to work with a translator and include all the pedagogic elements that make Validation training practical and skills-based. In March, the successful Presenter participants will co-teach the first Level 1 Worker Certification course offered in China since COVID-19.
